

WPPI Energy has entered into an all-requirements, long term power supply contract with each of the 51 customer-owned electric utilities it serves. Until recently, each contract was scheduled to expire at the end of 2037. As of March 24, 2016, WPPI and 49 of the long term purchasers have executed documents resulting in contracts with terms extending through the end of 2055.
